Program Changes

Due to the coronavirus, we have made adjustments to our programs to keep our clients, staff, and community safe while still fulfilling our mission.

- Clients, who live in the Pontiac area, and are in need of food services during the health crisis we are expanding our food pantry. La Casa Amiga Food pantry is by APPOINTMENT ONLY please call Liz at 248-338-4250 x 3700 to schedule an intake.
- The Saint Joseph Center of Hope reopened on March 31st. The capacity which will be served has been reduced to 3 clients at a time and several safety measures are being put in place to make this happen. The center is also assisting with emergency food boxes through the St. John's Pantry as well as having naloxone kits that can also be provided to those in need. Clients seeking food or naloxone are asked to call the center at 734-357-8880 and schedule a pick-up time.
- Our food program at All Saints Soup Kitchen reopened on April 14th after

necessary safety changes are made for Food Pantry only. The Soup Kitchen will be reopen on May 4th serving bagged lunches.

- **Starting May 4th**– Soup Kitchen Hours (Bagged Lunches): Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday- 11:00am-12:30pm
- **Starting April 14th**– Food Pantry Hours: Tuesday- 10:00am-12:00pm and Wednesday 1:30pm-3:00pm
